About Angel Shed and the Role

We are launching a new inter-generational singing group in the Summer term. It will be open to children (aged 7+) and young people, alongside parents, carers and other members of the community. Two Co-Leaders will deliver sessions supported by a facilitator teaching creative signing, Access Support Workers, and a team of volunteers.

We aim to establish a positive environment where participants, regardless of their backgrounds or experiences, can work together inclusively to create artistic work over which they have shared creative control and ownership. No experience is necessary for members to join the Choir and we support creative responses regardless of previous experience. Repertoire may include covers and/or original songs from the group. The group will be working towards taking part in a performance in July, alongside Angel Shed's Music Collective and other performers.

This is a Lead Facilitator role, responsible for the planning and delivery of weekly Angel Shed Choir sessions, stimulating and furthering music skills through engaging and appropriate activities. We are looking for motivated, dynamic, and committed facilitators who are passionate about inclusion, music, and working with children and young people. The successful applicant will enable creative responses from participants, enhancing their artistic, personal and social development. They will be a playful facilitator who can handle the creative unpredictability of sessions with a light-hearted approach and keep the wellbeing of participants always at the forefront.

Key responsibilities

- Work with the Artistic Director to promote and maintain a culture which values the highest standards; ensure it is inclusive, collaborative, safe and supportive, as well as artistically bold and ambitious.
- Create an artistic programme driven by inclusivity, originality, and a participant-led approach.
- Lead weekly sessions, with overall responsibility for content and delivery.
- Plan and deliver weekly staff and volunteer briefings and debriefs.
- Perform with or otherwise support the group at performances.
- Support participants' progression and offer pastoral support, supported by the Membership Manager.
- Be main point of contact for volunteers on session days and support them during sessions.
- Support the Safeguarding Leads on all safeguarding matters.

This is a guide to the nature of the work required by this role and may be reviewed as required.

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Person Specification

You must:

- be a confident choir facilitator with a positive attitude.
- have experience of leading sessions for children and young people.
- have experience working in SEN/D or inclusive settings.
- be able to foster good and supportive working relationships with staff, volunteers, and members.
- be someone who will value and maintain the positive and inclusive ethos of Angel Shed.

You will ideally:

- have been trained in safeguarding and child protection.
- have experience managing facilitators/volunteers.
- be competent on at least one accompanying instrument (e.g. piano, guitar).

At least one of the two Co-Leaders will need to be competent on an accompanying instrument (e.g. piano, guitar).
